Bendigo & District Aboriginal Cooperative (BDAC) is an ACCO (Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation) registered as a member under the umbrella of VACCHO

(Victorian Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation) and represented nationally through NACCHO (National

Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisation).

BDAC was founded to represent and provide services to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people living on Djaara Country.



BDAC has a responsibility to ensure growth of services, development of our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community, better and improved health outcomes for our people, improved quality of life and be a lead agency in providing self-determination employment and career pathways for Aboriginal people.

LOCAL WORK ENVIRONMENT

Bendigo and District Aboriginal Co-operative provides a range of specialist services for Community living on Djaara Country including a Medical Clinic, Health and Wellbeing, Family and Community Services, and Kindergarten.

POSITION OBJECTIVE

The Clinical Lead will play a pivotal role in providing strategic leadership to the clinic, the public intoxication team, and the chronic disease team, while offering mentoring to clinical staff to foster their professional development and ensure high-quality patient care for Community. This role involves leading quality improvement and assurance initiatives, overseeing clinical governance and risk management, and developing and updating clinical policies and protocols. The Clinical Lead will promote multidisciplinary collaboration to deliver comprehensive care and provide strategic insights to shape the future direction of BDAC Medical Clinic, ensuring it is prepared to meet Community needs with the new medical facility. By staying informed about emerging trends and opportunities in the healthcare sector, the Clinical Lead will position BDAC at the forefront

- Policy Development and Implementation: Lead the development, implementation, and regular updating of clinical policies and procedures, incorporating best practices and innovative approaches.
- Strategic Insights and Innovation: Provide strategic insights to shape the future direction of BDAC Medical Clinic, identifying and leveraging emerging trends and opportunities in the healthcare space. Measure the impact of initiatives on clinical outcomes, patient satisfaction, and operational efficiency.
- Reporting: Ensure timely and accurate completion of all reporting requirements, meeting organisational and regulatory standards.
- Patient-Centred Care: Champion a patient-centred approach, ensuring that the care provided meets the needs of Community and enhances patient satisfaction.

- Ability to provide strategic insights and contribute to the future direction of the clinic, identifying and leveraging emerging trends in healthcare.
- Strong analytical skills to interpret clinical data, identify areas for improvement, and develop evidence-based strategies.
- Experience in managing projects, including planning, implementation, and evaluation.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

- Must pass a Criminal Police Record Check.
- Must pass and provide copy of Working with Children's Check (or Teachers Registration if applicable).
- Must hold current full Victorian Drivers Licence and provide a copy.

- Must pass an Employment History check; and

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- Must have and maintain a commitment to child safety, equity, inclusion, and cultural safety.
- Vaccination Policy: all staff are encouraged to be vaccinated against whooping cough, measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) (if not immune), influenza (annually), hepatitis A and B, chicken pox (if not immune); shingles (for eligible people), and COVID-19. It is expected that Clinic and kindergarten staff will be vaccinated against the above diseases and will be required to complete a Vaccination Consent Form. It is also expected that Clinic staff will be vaccinated again diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (DtP).
